Night Sky Photo Exhibit

The exhibit consists of 55 prints by 12 local photographers. The main theme of the exhibit is the “Night Sky”. There are three sub-themes: “The Moon”, “Aurora Borealis” and “City Lights”.

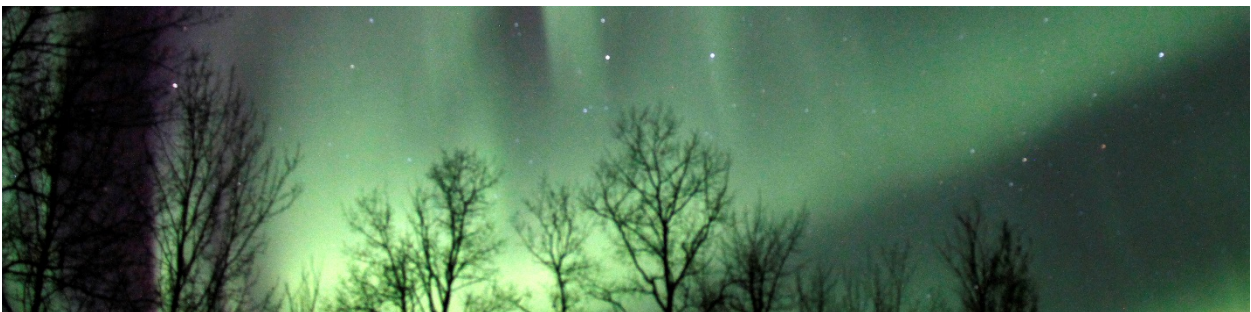
The exhibit is in the main Athabasca University building (low brown brick building across from the Multiplex. Enter the front doors of the building (near the fountains and three flag poles); turn left and proceed to another hallway on your left; and then go just past the Library’s entrance (past an exhibit of Pacific Invertebrates). The photo exhibit is in the hallway between the Library entrance and the main entrance to the Science Laboratory. If you get lost, just ask anyone in the building.

The exhibit will take about ½ to 1 hour to get to, view, and return to the Multiplex.
