Rotary Youth Academy Adventures in Photography & the Night Sky Athabasca, AB – Sept 30 to Oct 2, 2016 <u>Program Description</u>

Offered by Rotary Club of Athabasca in cooperation with Science Outreach-Athabasca and Athabasca University

This Adventures program is an opportunity for participants to learn about the science, technology and art of photography, especially as it applies to astronomy. Participants will use digital Single Lens Reflex (SLR) cameras to make still photographs of the night sky as well as other subjects (e.g. sunsets, landscapes, portraits, close-ups). Participants will improve their photography knowledge and hands-on skills to make better photographs, especially under low light conditions, with whatever camera and other equipment that they have available.

During the three afternoon/night workshop, students will learn about various kinds of photographic equipment and techniques as well as the history of photography and how cameras work. They will also visit two working observatories, learn about the moon, stars and planets, and gain the ability to make better photographs – no matter what camera they use. The observatories and Science Outreach – Athabasca are part of the Centre for Science and the Faculty of Science and Technology of Athabasca University.

Participants must be students who have completed Grades 9, 10, 11 or 12 by September 2016; are interested in photography and astronomy; and obtain written permission from a parent or guardian. Photography experience is beneficial but not necessary. The program is limited to 10 students.

What Is Provided

Members of the Rotary Club of Athabasca will billet participants, provide meals, beverages and snacks. As well, club members will transport participants to/from the campus of Athabasca University and to/from the observatory at Long Lake, about ½ hour west from the Town of Athabasca. Some camera equipment is available for participants to use during the workshop and participants are encouraged to bring any camera equipment they use (but not point & shoot compact cameras).

Cost – \$375 per participant, usually paid by a sponsoring Rotary Club Deadline to apply – May 31, 2016
