"Unwanted Guests"

Speaker:

Robert Holmberg, Professor Emeritus of Biology at Athabasca University

- Did you know that head lice are now resistant to most insecticidal shampoos? What are the alternatives?
- How do I prevent getting bed bugs when I travel? If I get an infestation, what are the options for eradication?
- Can humans get tapeworms from cats and dogs via fleas? How can I prevent this from happening to my children?

This presentation will answer such questions. It will cover the identification, importance (including possible diseases), life cycle, prevention and control of three groups of human ecto-parasites: lice (including head, body and pubic), bed bugs and various fleas.
