Although he has travelled extensively to places in Central and South America, and Southeast Asia, this was his first trip to Africa.

As a result of his three week trip to Zambia, Botswana and Namibia in February and March of 2007, Terry will take us on a photographic journey to look at everything from dung beetles that specialize in elephant dung to the elephants themselves. He will also explore such famous landscapes as Victoria Falls, the sand dunes of the Namibian Desert, and a visit to a Himba village...
