What to bring: Appropriate clothing for the weather and footwear for walking on irregular or wet ground. Water. Optional: binoculars, field guide books, insect repellent, snacks. A small packsack may be useful. Children are welcome but we may walk several kilometers. Outdoor toilets are available.

What not to bring: Dogs will scare away birds and mammals.
